3 hours by train from Paris, Pass through vineyards whose appellations will make you dream. Taking the Route des Grands Crus means discovering what makes Burgundy so special: its Climats. They are the reflection of a very special landscape

Discover the wine-growing landscapes of Burgundy, whose "Climats", the name given to the plots of vines, have been listed as a **Unesco World Heritage Site** in 2015.

Pass through villages with evocative names: **Chablis, Pommard, Gevrey-Chambertin, Puligny-Montrachet, Meursault, Saint Véran, Pouilly-Fuissé...** and let yourself be seduced by some of the 84 appellations that make up this region renowned for its art of living.

Home to the Pinot Noir and Chardonnay grape varieties, the Burgundy vineyards offer a wide variety of wines, some of the most famous in the world.

Chassagne Montrachet

Chassagne-Montrachet, in the south of the Côte de Beaune, is a group of houses squeezed around a church and three châteaux, set in a sea of vines. It shares its grands crus with Puligny-Montrachet.

The Montrachet vineyard is the pearl of Burgundy's white wines.

With a history stretching back thousands of years, it houses a number of cellars dating back to the 12th century, containing the precision work of past generations. Today, almost 700,000 bottles are stored here, containing wines prized by oenophiles.
