Pass through vineyards whose appellations will make you dream. Taking the Route des Grands Crus means discovering what makes Burgundy so special: its Climats. They are the reflection of a very special landscape.

Discover the wine-growing landscapes of Burgundy, whose "Climats", the name given to the plots of vines, have been listed as a **Unesco World Heritage Site** in 2015.

Pass through villages with evocative names: **Chablis, Pommard, Gevrey-Chambertin, Puligny-Montrachet, Meursault, Saint Véran, Pouilly-Fuissé...** and let yourself be seduced by some of the 84 appellations that make up this region renowned for its art of living.

Home to the Pinot Noir and Chardonnay grape varieties, the Burgundy vineyards offer a wide variety of wines, some of the most famous in the world.



The Côte de Nuits: an exceptional terroir between Dijon and Nuits saint Georges

Your sommelier guide will take you on a tour of the Grands Crus of the Côte de Nuits, an invitation to an oenological and sensory journey !

You'll set off to discover these passionate estates and winegrowers, who work all year round to produce the finest wines and delight your taste buds.

The Côte de Nuits is inextricably linked with the monks of Citeaux Abbey, not far from Nuits-Saint-Georges, who patiently developed the vineyards and built the famous Clos de Vougeot in the 12th century.

The region boasts some thirty appellations, divided according to the "crus" scale, with villages boasting prestigious names (Gevrey-Chambertin, Shamble-Musigny, Oneiromancer, Nuits-Saint-Georges, etc.).

A region rich in premier crus and, above all, grand crus, around the villages of **Gevrey-Chambertin, Morey-Saint-Denis, Chambolle -Musigny, Vougeot, Flagey-Echézeaux and Vosne-Romanée**: the Côte de Nuits boasts twenty-four Grand Crus, including the legendary **Romanée-Conti**.



Dijon: Nicknamed the 'City of a hundred steeples

A lively city combining culture and pleasure, it is a UNESCO World Heritage Site.

Gevrey Chambertin : The Village of 9 grands crus

A charming little village surrounded by vineyards, with a superb 11th-century medieval castle.

Vougeot : A legendary Clos and a Château

Famous the world over, the Château du Clos de Vougeot is a historic landmark on the Route des Grands Crus.

Abbaye de Cîteaux : Monks and their cheeses

Vosne-Romanée : Top rated -plots

It includes the legendary Romanée Conti wine.



The Route des Grands Crus, nicknamed the "Champs Elysées of Burgundy", offers you a unique experience as you discover many prestigious winegrowers.

Over 60 kilometres long, this route takes you from the town of Dijon to Santenay, passing through 37 charming villages.
