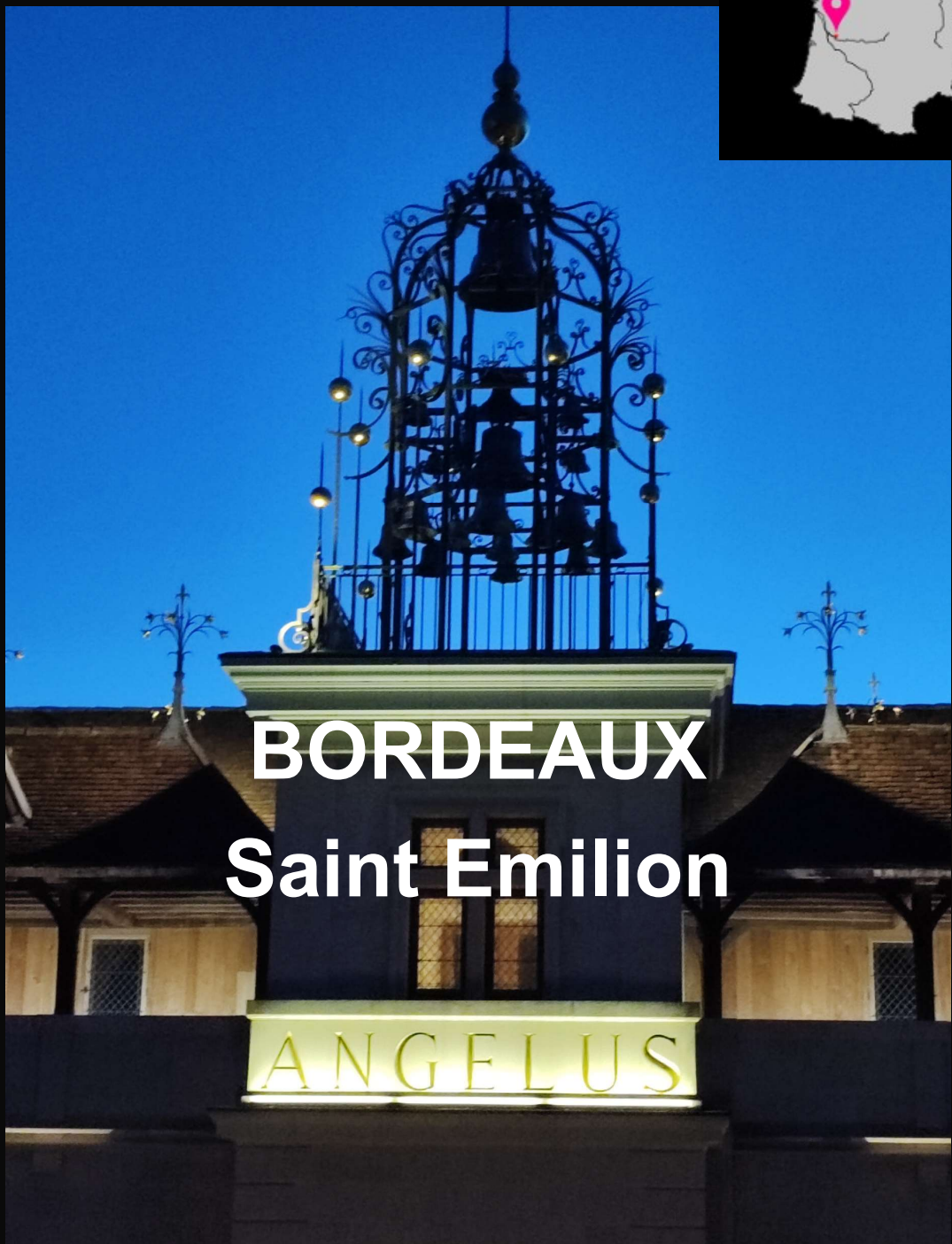

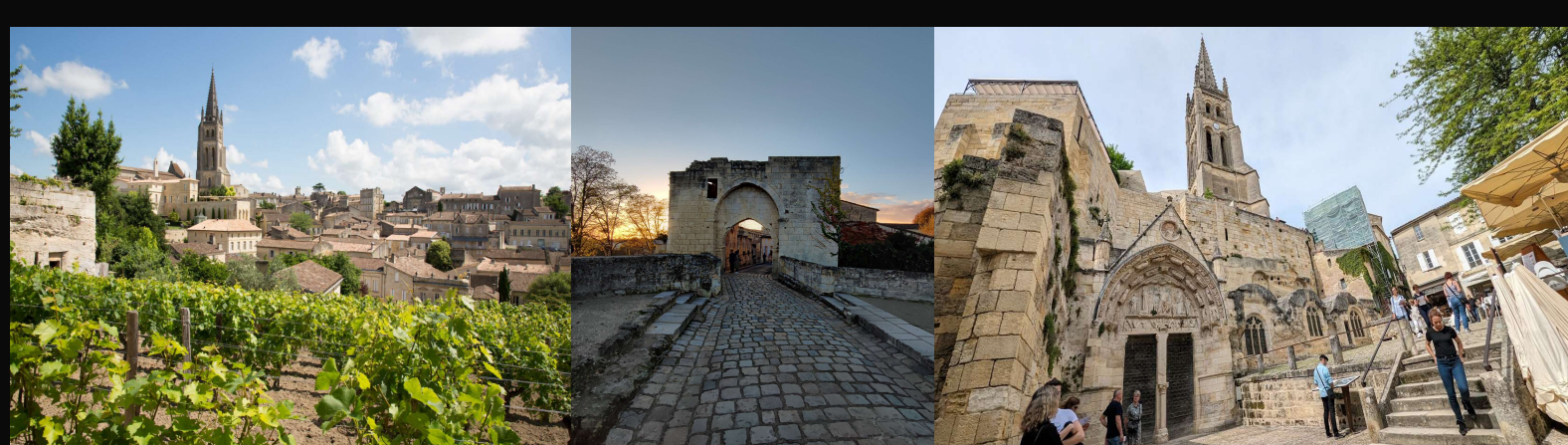
Pick-up by your sommelier guide from Saint-Jean station in BORDEAUX

2 hours by train from Paris,
A UNESCO World Heritage Site, the village of Saint Emilion
is a medieval town at the heart of the famous Bordeaux
vineyards.

You'll be able to appreciate over two thousand years
of history between man and vine.

Saint-Emilion also owes its exceptional character to its
great diversity of terroirs.

The variety of its wines can be explained by a remarkable
geological diversity (chalky, clayey-limestone, gravelly and
sandy soils) and a microclimate perfectly suited to
viticulture. This combination, combined with the meticulous
care given to the vines by the winemakers, provides the
ideal conditions for the nutrition and ripeness of the Merlot
grape, the dominant variety. In fact, the variety of Saint-
Emilion wines is also due to a skilful blend of grape
varieties (Merlot in the majority, combined with Cabernet
Franc and Cabernet Sauvignon) which allows them to
blossom with a range of olfactory and gustatory nuances
that are particularly appreciated.

The village was originally a medieval town built on the site of a 7th-century monastery.

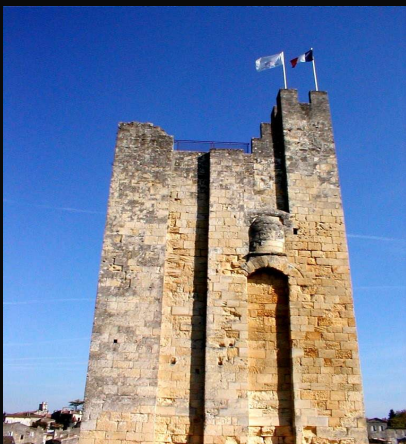
As you wander through the winding streets, you'll be able to admire some of the remains of this period, such as :

The King's Tower, a citadel keep built in 1237

The monolithic church, a former 11th-century church carved out of the rock.

The Cordeliers cloister, built in the 13th century and containing underground cellars.

The archbishops' palace The remains of the fortifications.

You'll set off to discover these passionate estates and winemakers, who work all year round to produce the finest wines and delight your taste buds.

Saint Emilion is also an excellent opportunity to sample the many local products typical of the region. This gourmet speciality has been passed down from generation to generation in Saint-Émilion since the Ursuline nuns established their convent in the medieval town in 1620.

A sommelier will be on hand throughout the day to share his experience and help you discover the treasures of this carefully selected region.
